WELCOME TO THE ORTHODOX CHURCH!

A Brief History

Orthodoxy dates from the founding of the Church on the Day of Pentecost, 33 A.D., fifty days after the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, the Holy Apostles went forth to establish churches throughout the Middle East. St. Paul, the most dynamic of the Apostles, traveled west from Jerusalem, founding churches in Asia Minor, Greece, and ultimately Rome. The early Church was led by five autocephalous (self-governing) patriarchates: Rome, Constantinople, Alexandria, Antioch, and Jerusalem. The Orthodox Christian Church maintains the worship, teachings, and traditions of the early Church as articulated by the Church Fathers and formulated in the Seven Ecumenical Councils of the undivided Church convened during the fourth to eighth centuries (325-787 A.D.).
