Resurrectional Apolytikion in the Fourth Mode

The women disciples of the Lord heard from the angel, the joyful news of the Resurrection and the repeal of the sentence imposed upon our forefathers. With pride they said to the Apostles, "Death is vanquished, Christ our God is risen bestowing upon the world His great mercy."

Receiving Holy Communion - We welcome to this celebration of the Divine Liturgy those Christians who are from other Christian Denominations and who are not fully united with us. Sadly, it is a consequence of the divisions in Christianity that we cannot extend to you an invitation to receive Holy Communion. Orthodox Christians believe that the Eucharist is the work or action of the celebrating Community signifying a oneness of faith, life, and worship of the believing Community. Reception of Holy Communion by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must pray. **However, all present** are welcome to partake of the Antidoro (blessed bread) which is distributed at the end of the Liturgy.

Now, brethren, you know that the household of Stephanas were the first converts in Achaia, and they have devoted themselves to the service of the saints; I urge you to be subject to such men and to every fellow worker and laborer. I rejoice at the coming of Stephanas and Fortunatus and Achaicos, because they have made up for your absence; for they refreshed my spirit as well as yours. Give recognition to such men. The churches of Asia send greetings. Aquila and Prisca, together with the church in their house, send you hearty greetings in the Lord. All the brethren send greetings. Greet one another with a holy kiss. I, Paul, write this greeting with my own hand. If any one has no love for the Lord, let him be accursed. Our Lord, come! The grace of the Lord Jesus be with you. My love be with you all in Christ Jesus. Amen.

The Reading is from Matthew 21:33-42


The Lord said this parable, "There was a householder who planted a vineyard, and set a hedge around it, and dug a wine press in it, and built a tower, and let it out to tenants, and went into another country. When the season of fruit drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants, to get his fruit; and the tenants took his servants and beat one, killed another, and stoned another. Again he sent other servants, more than the first; and they did the same to them. Afterward he sent his son to them, saying 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir; come, let us kill him and have his inheritance.' And they took him and cast him out of the vineyard and killed him. When therefore the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?" They said to him, "He will put those wretches to a miserable death, and let out the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the fruits in their seasons." Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the scriptures: 'The very stone which the builders rejected has become the head of the corner; this was the Lord's doing, and it is marvelous in our eyes?"'

Saints & Feast Days



September 03 Anthimus, Bishop of Nicomedea

After the death of the 20,000 Martyrs of Nicomedia, their Bishop Anthimus fled to a certain village to care for his remaining flock. The Emperor Maximian sent men in search of him. When they found him, he promised to show Anthimus to them, but first took them in as guests, fed them, and only then made himself known to them. Amazed at his kindness, the

soldiers promised him to tell Maximian that they had not found him. But Anthimus went willingly with them, and converting them by his admonitions, baptized them on the way. He boldly confessed his Faith before Maximian, and after frightful tortures was beheaded in the year 303 or 304.



September 4

Moses the Prophet & Godseer

The Prophet Moses-whose name means "one who draws forth," or "is drawn from," that is, from the water-was the pinnacle of the lovers of wisdom, the supremely wise lawgiver, the most ancient historian of all. He was of the tribe of Levi, the son of Amram and Jochabed (Num. 26:59). He

was born in Egypt in the seventeenth century before Christ. While yet a babe of three months, he was placed in a basket made of papyrus and covered with pitch, and cast into the streams of the Nile for fear of Pharaoh's decree to the mid-wives of the Hebrews, that all the male children of the Hebrews be put to death. He was taken up from the river by Pharaoh's daughter, became her adopted son, and was reared and dwelt in the King's palace for forty years. Afterward, when he was some sixty years old, he fled to Madian, where, on Mount Horeb, he saw the vision of the burning bush. Thus he was ordained by God to lead Israel and bring it out of the land of Egypt. He led Israel through the Red Sea as it were dry land and governed the people for forty years. He wrought many signs and wonders, and wrote the first five books of the Old Testament, which are called the Pentateuch. When he reached the land of Moab, he ascended Mount Nabau, on the peak called Phasga, and there, by divine command, he reposed in the sixteenth century before Christ, having lived for some 120 years. The first two Odes of the Old Testament, "Let us sing to the Lord" and "Attend, O heaven, and I will speak," were written by him. Of these hymns, the first was chanted by the shore of the Red Sea as soon as the Israelites had crossed it; the second, in the land of Moab, a few days before his repose. The Holy High Priest Aaron was the elder brother of the Holy Prophet Moses. He was appointed by God to serve as the spokesman of Moses before the people, and also before Pharaoh, in Egypt. Afterwards, in the wilderness, he was called to the ministry of the high priesthood, as narrated in the books of Exodus, Leviticus, and Numbers in the Old Testament. The name Aaron means "enlightened."

SERMON

WHATEVER YOU DO, DO IT WITH LOVE

Today's Epistle passage comes from the last chapter of the First Epistle to the Corinthians of the Apostle Paul. The attentive student of Paul's Epistles will have noticed that the Apostle at the end of his epistles usually proceeds to a final admonition of his readers, to summarize whatever he has extensively previously mentioned. So also, in our passage, he recommends the following to the Corinthians:

"Be watchful, stand firm in the faith, be courageous, be strong." The word "be watchful" means for the believer to be striving to be in a state of constant attention and watchfulness with regard to his spiritual life. This, moreover, is also the exhortation of the Lord to His Disciples: "Be watchful and pray, so that you not enter into temptation" (Matthew 26:41). I am watchful means readiness for the reception of the Coming of the Lord, Who comes from the future of the final reign of His Kingdom in its present history of this age. Because with the incarnation of Christ, the Kingdom of God has come into the world. The word of Christ has the energy of the Kingdom of God, and the acceptance of His word is acceptance of His Kingdom.

"Stand firm in the faith"; this is the apostolic exhortation that the believers should not be led astray by erroneous heterodox teachings which change the faith. Paul recommends that they not be influenced by currents and trends of the world, as happened with some Corinthians in the matter, for example, of the resurrection of the dead. "Be courageous" means the effort that every believer must make for his spiritual maturity, through the holy mysteries and the holy evangelical virtues. "Be strong"; this recommendation indicates the concentration of strength and power so that the struggle of the believer can be effective. This power is drawn from the indescribable power of God (Jer. 16:19), which is manifested through the weakness of man (2 Cor. 12:9). And, naturally, Paul's last exhortation that all the actions of believers be inspired by love, refers to the unhindered flow of love to the Body of the Church. More specifically, it is unthinkable to selfishly retain love as God's gift to man, and that it not be diffused as a life-giving current towards one's fellow man. After all, God's love is the pre-eminent characteristic of every true believer (John 13:35).

Severance from the Ecclesiastical Community

The Apostle does not fail to point out the ultimate danger which refers to those who do not "like", i.e. do not love sincerely and do not believe in the Lord Jesus. These gradually lead to separation, to being cut off, i.e. their excommunication from the Body of the Church, the Body of the living Christ. This cut-offing is voluntary, as the person chooses it of his own free will. However, we believers await the coming of the Lord, as Paul says: "Maran atha'. The phrase is Aramaic, which according to the great Byzantine theologian Zegavenos (1050-1120) is interpreted: "The Lord has come, and you are sleeping?" God has so much come down, and you are not being lifted up not even a little?".

"The Life of the Saints "In Christ"

The Saints of the Church lived with love, vigilance, and firmness in faith, with bravery and the power of God. One of them is also Saint Nektarios, Bishop of Pentapolis, in Aegina, the exhumation of whose holy relics we celebrate today. The above apostolic exhortations were intertwined with the ethos of his martyrical and apostolic life. That is why everywhere and always it radiated the light, love, peace, the holiness of God. His monastic dedication at the New Monastery of Chios, his

burning desire to study theology, his ministry in the Patriarchate of Alexandria as Bishop as also in the Church of Greece as a preacher of Euboia and Phthiotida and Fokida, his 14-year service as director of the Rizareion Ecclesiastical School, his settling as a simple monk-priest and spiritual father in the Sacred Monastery of the Holy Trinity of Aegina, but, primarily, his trust and unspeakable love for God, his perseverance in the trials, the slanders, the malice of men and demons, all these and many more, showed him a living image of Christ, a rule of faith, and a very great Saint and miracle worker. May his holy prayers cover all of us and may we be worthy of his divine patronage.


