Resurrectional Apolytikion in the Grave Mode

By Your Cross, O Christ our God, You destroyed death. You opened paradise to the thief. You transformed the lament of the Myrrh-bearing women, and You commanded the Apostles to proclaim You are risen, granting the world Your great mercy.

Seasonal Kontakion in the Fourth Mode

Today, the most pure temple of the Savior, the precious bridal chamber and Virgin, the sacred treasure of God, enters the house of the Lord, bringing the grace of the Divine Spirit. The Angels of God praise her. She is the heavenly tabernacle.

Receiving Holy Communion - We welcome to this celebration of the Divine Liturgy those Christians who are from other Christian Denominations and who are not fully united with us. Sadly, it is a consequence of the divisions in Christianity that we cannot extend to you an invitation to receive Holy Communion. Orthodox Christians believe that the Eucharist is the work or action of the celebrating Community signifying a oneness of faith, life, and worship of the believing Community. Reception of Holy Communion by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must pray. **However, all present** are welcome to partake of the Antidoro (blessed bread) which is distributed at the end of the Liturgy.

Epistle Reading

Prokeimenon. Grave Mode. Psalm 28.11,1.

The Lord will give strength to his people. Verse: Bring to the Lord, O sons of God, bring to the Lord honor and glory.

The reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 2:14-22.

Brethren, Christ is our peace, who has made us both one, and has broken down the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in his flesh the law of commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby bringing the hostility to an end. And he came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built into it for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

This night your soul is required of you; and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." As he said these things, he cried out: "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

Saints & Feast Days

November 19

Martyr Barlaam of Caesarea

Saint Barlaam, who was from a certain village near Antioch in Syria, was advanced in years and a husbandman by occupation. Because of his confession of Christ, he was brought before the judge, who had him scourged with whips and then scraped with iron claws. Since this could not break his constancy, he was forcibly haled to the idols' temple, and live coals with incense were placed in his right hand. The judge thought that he would cast them down because of the pain, thus seeming to have offered a sacrifice of incense to the idols. But Saint Barlaam stood unmoving until his hand was thoroughly burned by the coals; he fell to the ground, and so gave up his soul into the hands of the Lord. He contested in martyrdom during the reign of Diocletian (284-305). Saint Basil the Great and Saint John Chrysostom both gave homilies in his honor.

According to the tradition of the Church, the Theotokos was brought to the Temple at three years of age, where she was consecrated to God and spent her days until she was fourteen or fifteen years old; and then, as a mature maiden, by the common counsel of the priests (since

her parents had reposed some three years before), she was betrothed to Joseph.

SERMON

"CHRIST IS OUR PEACE"

The central point of today's Epistle reading is the peace, which Christ offers to the world. This peace is inconceivable to the human mind; "it surpasses all understanding" (Phil. 4:7), as Paul writes in another of his epistles. And this, because it is not simply about a peaceful framework for social living or about the demand for harmonious coexistence between peoples; nor about something that is founded on worldly regimes and human achievements. Christ himself is the personification of God's peace and of reconciliation, the One who wants to lead man to reconciliation with God, with himself, with his fellow man. As Saint Cyril of Alexandria says: "we are all one both in one another and in Christ; for Christ is the bond of unity".

Christ's Offer of Peace

Christ, says the Apostle, by His death on the cross tore down that which, like a wall, divided and caused enmity between two conflicting worlds, the Jews and the Gentiles; he united them in one body and reconciled them to God. This is the work of Christ in every age; since the motive which causes enmity, division, the feeling of superiority over others is egotism, the root of all sin and evil in people's lives. However, Christ with His humility and peace overturns the power of sin, that is, the heavy confusion within man himself and between men, which leads to violence and the conflicts. Since sin breaks up the harmonious function of existence and causes disharmony and opposition of the various powers between them. The transcendence of this situation is found in man's acceptance of Christ's love, which pacifies our inner world. Then the person ceases to oppose the other, in order to dominate and impose himself. He foretastes the abolition of corruption and death with the power of love and the peace of Christ.

Finding Peace

In the person of Christ, Who is perfect God and perfect Man, man finds true peace. The struggle to find it outside of God often disappoints man. Because world peace is limited and fragile and its preservation is faulty and conventional. It is wounded by egotism and selfishness by the prevailing of the law of the powerful one and the lack of freedom, justice, truth and love. Saint Gregory Palamas referring to the ways with which peace is realized in relation to God, ourselves and our fellow man urges us to make peace with God, doing what pleases Him. That is, living according to His holy will, with wisdom, love, repentance, and prayer. Subsequently, he recommends that we make peace with ourselves by subjecting the carnal train of thought and egotism to the Spirit and the Word of God, attending to our conscience and taking care of the purity of our calculations. And finally, he asks us to make peace with other people, as much as it depends on us, having true love for them, understanding, forgiveness, magnanimity, just as Christ has for everyone.

Striving To Acquire Peace

Peace is not simply the absence of clashes and conflict under their various forms but, primarily, it is a spiritual condition that consists in the presence of Christ in our lives. Certainly, peace as an unfailing condition exists only in the Kingdom of God. However, as the Kingdom of God begins

from the present life and is within us, thus also is the peace of God. In this way, the peace of God appears as given and as requested as present and as expected. May we, with the bond of peace, which is offered to us as a fruit of the evangelical life and as a gift of God, experience the reconciliation in Christ with everyone; may we foretaste from the present of history to the forever of Paradise.


